Relation of The Religion of the Stars to Christianity.—The Church of Light believes the evolution of mankind is possible only in so far as the people as a whole have free access to extensive and reliable information, are free to discuss the implications of such information, are encouraged to think for themselves, and are permitted to pass on to others the opinions they form from thinking and discussion. These liberties are guaranteed by the American Bill of Rights, which in spite of any possible economic change in the future, we believe every American should work diligently to maintain.

We oppose the rule of Nietzsche "supermen"; dictators who use intellect and force to impose their wills, and their beliefs, upon others; and who, to use the people for their own ends, suppress and distort information, and forbid free discussion and the expression of opinions contrary to their own.

But it is not, and has not been, our purpose to disparage Christianity or other popular orthodox religions. Instead—as was repeatedly pointed out during 1910-14, while material for the B. of L. lessons was being assembled, as well as since their writing was commenced on March 21, 1914—The Religion of the Stars has been revived and modernized for the express purpose of providing a satisfactory religion, based upon demonstrated science, for those who already have renounced the orthodox churches.

In no sense was it the purpose of The Religion of the Stars to attack orthodox religion. Instead, it did and does, aggressively attack the crass materialism which then and now so rapidly was emptying the churches.

In some of the first B. of L. publications it was emphasized that Nietzsche's philosophy that might makes the real morality, and that the exploitation of the weak by brutal so-called "supermen" is the logical capstone of the conception of life encouraged by a material science which recognizes no world other than the physical and no intelligence superior to its own.

In the 1880's Nietzsche put forth his philosophy, which is painfully logical if the physical be all, and shortly after went insane.

While material for the B. of L. lessons was being assembled, to outward appearance the world was still vigorously sound; yet nevertheless was it rapidly following in Nietzsche's footsteps. And before the end of 1914, it too went insane.

Even when the armistice was signed, November 11, 1918, few realized how completely gross materialism had eaten away the vitals of Christianity; few understood that a new age had commenced for which Piscean Faith alone would not suffice; an Aquarian Age which demanded knowledge.

The Religion of the Stars has the definite mission, not of discrediting orthodoxy, but of furnishing provable facts which can be used to defeat the world-wide drive to disparage spirituality and discountenance the belief in life after physical death.

At the time the B. of L. lessons commenced to be

written on March 21, 1914, to most the future of Christianity seemed assured. Yet in only 25 short years half of Europe—Russia and Germany—has turned from it as a childish superstition. And in its stead we find Nietzsche's philosophy—the inevitable philosophy of those who believe the earth is the only abode of man and that physical death ends all—now gaining momentum on every hand. Manchuria was raped, Ethiopia was enslaved, Austria was violated and Czechoslovakia was betrayed by those who accept this materialistic dogma. And over vast populations we at present witness ruling in the persons of Stalin, Mussolini and Hitler, just such "supermen" as Nietzsche envisioned.

Jesus, outstanding teacher of the Piscean Age, left two commandments: Preach the gospel and heal the sick. No less today than 2,000 years ago is there need of unselfish ones who, even at great sacrifice, shall preach the gospel; but if now such preaching is to be effective it must appeal not to Faith alone, but present also provable facts. And it is such facts that the B. of L. lessons are intended to supply.

Today, even as in early Christian times, there is

need to heal the sick. But illness is not confined to the body; it may be illness of the purse, illness of the affections, or illness of the spiritual nature. And he who today successfully preaches the gospel of The Religion of the Stars should be prepared to heal not one, but all, of these maladies.

With due deference to the benefits provided by the religions of the past, it is as ridiculous to hold that, "the old time religion is good enough for me," as it is to hold that the horse and buggy are good enough, the house without plumbing, the tallow candle, the spinning wheel; and that the automobile, modern sanitation, electric lights and machinery should not be used.

In the B. of L. lessons, present-day knowledge has included up-to-date facts which afford a firm foundation. But to imply that The Religion of the Stars as now set forth in these lessons should not be subject to progressive improvement is as ridiculous as to imply that scientific discovery and invention have reached ultimate perfection and that no further mechanical advancement will be made.

If a study of nature teaches us anything, it teaches us that nothing stands still. That which refuses to progress and adapt itself to new conditions as they arise inevitably perishes; and this is as true of religions and civilizations as of sensate forms of life.

The Religion of the Stars as now presented in the B. of L. lessons represents our highest present state of knowledge, and thus affords a solid foundation for the future; but it is not a completed structure. Nor will the structure ever be completed; for such would imply there was no more knowledge to acquire and that no improvement could be made in its presentation.

To insure that The Religion of the Stars shall be progressive, we have organized three distinct B. of L. research departments to act as feed lines to the B. of L. lessons as, from time to time, they are revised and brought up to date, and as feed lines for B. of L. periodical literature. It is our belief that the success of the B. of L. lessons to continue to perform their mission depends almost exclusively upon the diligence and intelligence with which the B. of L. Astrological Research Department, the B. of L. ESP Research Department, and the B. of L. Control of Life Research Department perform the work with which they have been intrusted.

While these three research departments, acting as feed lines which constantly supply new and provable information, are in charge of specified individuals, they, as well as other Church of Light activities, are of a widely co-operative nature. We want everyone, whether affiliated with the C. of L. or not, who sympathizes with our political objectives, to co-operate with us in realizing them. And we want everyone, whether affiliated with the C. of L. or not, who sympathizes with the aims of any one of our three research departments to co-operate in acquiring information which it can use. We have great faith that, as time flows by, an increasing number of people will see so much good resulting from our various endeavors that they will sacrifice work, or money, or both, to help us make them even more effective.

ESP Problem Number Four: That of Extension of Consciousness to the Information Desired.—When through inhibiting cerebral thinking and focusing the attention on the inner plane, as was explained in the June, 1939, issue of the QUARTERLY, inner plane consciousness has been attained, the next step is to Extend the Consciousness to the information it is desired to acquire.

Such extension of consciousness requires that the unconscious mind shall have sufficient desire to acquire the information that it makes the effort to obtain it, and that it has at its command sufficient energy to enable it to accomplish this task.

The soul, which is merely another name for the unconscious mind, possesses senses and faculties by which it can acquire information and perform work

on the inner plane where physical restrictions of time, distance and gravitation do not obtain. Although these senses and faculties require training to get best results, every person's unconscious mind possesses them, just as every normal individual has a physical brain and physical senses, whether or not he is efficient in their use.

But no matter how well trained his brain may be, an individual can do objective thinking only when he supplies his brain with electrical energies of proper frequency and of sufficient volume. Cerebral thinking is made possible through certain frequencies of electromagnetic radiations in the production of which electricity is consumed. An individual who is too fatigued, or whose electrical energies are being too greatly used in emotional channels or in the digestion of food, cannot think properly, because his brain is not supplied with proper electromagnetic radiations.

In a like manner, no matter how well trained the senses and faculties of his soul may be, an individual cannot properly extend his consciousness on the inner plane, or do other work there, unless these senses and faculties are supplied with the type of energies which they use. And to supply them with the energy which they require for vigorous and active work, if he is still in the flesh, he must develop in his nervous system high-frequency electromagnetic radiations.

A little rhythmic breathing, together with a slight tensing of the nerves, to one who has had some practice in acquiring proper electrification, will place him in the mood, or state of feeling, in which his nervous system, instead of developing the frequencies used by vitality or for cerebral thinking, generates high-frequency electromagnetic radiations which astrologically are associated with the upper-octave planets. Once the switch of his Attention has diverted the electrical energies of his nervous system into developing these high-frequency electromagnetic radiations, he will need no longer to tense his nerves; merely continue whatever rhythmic swing in his breathing has enabled him thus to switch his nervous system to generating, instead of the lower frequencies it commonly develops, these high-frequency radiations.

He will recognize the frequencies which can be used in Intellectual ESP through an intensified alertness which is not related so much to the brain as to his whole surrounding aura. In every region of himself, and extending from his physical body in all directions, is a peculiar aliveness, and a feeling that, instead of being receptive, he is radiating very fine energies outward from every part of himself.

These high-frequency electromagnetic radiations which produce this keen awareness transform a portion of their energy into vibrations which, having velocity greater than 186,173 miles a second, are astral in nature. And it is upon the astral energies so developed that the individual must depend for volitional extension of consciousness, or for other control of the activities of his unconscious mind.

Thus as already indicated, in order to extend his consciousness to desired information, in addition to giving his unconscious mind proper instructions as to the nature of the information desired and inducing it to endeavor to acquire it, he must furnish it, through electromagnetic radiations of the proper frequency and volume, with sufficient astral energy to do the job required of it.

To avoid focusing the extended consciousness on the wrong thing, it should be quite definite and clear what information is to be sought. For practice in this work the ESP cards are admirable, and provide an accurate method of keeping score on progress. When it is clearly understood just what information is sought, there should be no cerebral concentration on the thought, but instead, a feeling of confidence that the desired information will be acquired.

Instead of holding the thought in the brain, move the Attention to the region back of the heart, as explained in the June QUARTERLY, forcing the thought that the consciousness will be extended down

out of the brain to where the attention is held. Instead of expressing the desire for extension of consciousness to the information sought, repress it until, without entirely losing it, it is barely on the rim of the consciousness where the attention now is held. Then, with the attention thus functioning on the inner plane, give the thought of extension of consciousness a little shove. From this region outside of the body and back of the heart, give it impetus, not from the brain, but from the magnetic field of the sympathetic nervous system.

If there are adequate electromagnetic energies present when the little impulse is given, the consciousness will move to the region or thing about which information is sought, and what it thus perceives will be apprehended by the unconscious mind.

In the sense of being greatly disturbed or greatly influenced by the vibrations of that which is contacted, in such Intellectual ESP—which should not be confused with Feeling ESP—there is no greater sensitiveness to the vibrations than there is when on a dark night you focus your electric torch on an object and thus gain information about it. You are aware of whatever is contacted on the inner plane through extension of consciousness in as positive and undisturbing a way as if it were a physical object seen by the light of such an electric torch.

After the tests have been completed, kindly send a report of the results to our ESP Research Department.

The Ephemeris Situation.—On April 6, 1939, we sent to W. Foulsham and Co., Ltd., London, our order for Raphael's Combined Almanac and Ephemeris for 1940, and our order for Raphael's Ephemeris for 1940. This order for our complete supply of these items was acknowledged by Foulsham and Co., Ltd., and confirmed in a letter from them dated April 21, 1939, ending in these words: "and we hope to send you the first supply towards the end of July."

Expecting that, as usual, shipments would be made to us throughout August, early in July we forwarded funds to cover a very considerable portion of this large order, and received a receipt for same from Foulsham and Co., dated July 22, 1939.

From that date on, in spite of air mail letters written by us and sent registered mail, we were unable to get a reply until October 4, or learn anything about our order, which should have been filled in August. On October 4 we received a letter from W. Foulsham and Co., stating that all American orders received by them prior to outbreak of the war had been cancelled; that owing to rising production costs and compulsory Government Insurance of goods in stock to cover Air Raid damage the price of Raphael's Ephemeris had been raised 50%, and the price of Raphael's Combined Almanac had been raised 43%; and that if we wished these items it would be necessary to re-order at the new price.

On October 5, we sent a registered, air-mail letter, instructing Foulsham and Co. to fill our order for these items at the new price. We sincerely hope that by the time this **QUARTERLY** is received from the printer that we shall have an ample supply.

In the inclosed Catalogue for 1940 of **ONE THOUSAND AND ONE BOOKS** you will find listed 130 new titles. We have experienced no difficulty in getting books from England other than those printed by W. Foulsham and Co. And we will do all that is humanly possible to give our customers good service even on these.

To those who are exasperated at not getting Raphael's Ephemeris on time, permit us to point out that there are three excellent yearly ephemerides printed in America, all of which we can supply at 25 cents each.

The years 1931 to 1950 are computed for Universal Time, or Zero Hour (midnight) Greenwich, which is 12 hours before Greenwich Mean Noon on the same day. The volumes run. 1880 to 1890, 1890 to 1900, 1900 to 1910, 1910 to 1920, 1920 to 1930, 1930 to 1940, and 1940 to 1950.

Pluto Information.—The Pluto Ephemeris hitherto used by astrological students was imported from Germany, and now, due to the war, can no longer be had. Seeing students in such a jam, the Aries Press of Chicago commenced printing the positions of Pluto from 1840 to 1960.

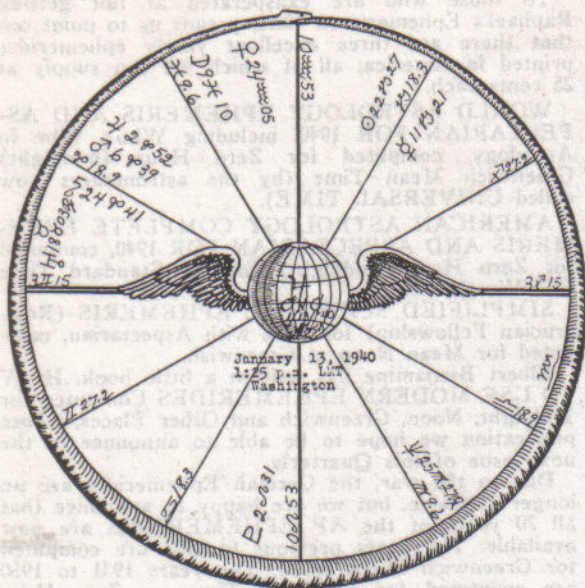
Knowing that The Brotherhood of Light Astrological Research Department during the past ten years has been conducting an intensive research program relative to Pluto, before finishing the book they asked Elbert Benjamin to write a short chapter to be included in it on the influence of Pluto.

Where the World is Heading.—Because by the time the September Quarterly was ready for the printer it was obvious that what was said in the June, 1939, Quarterly, was right at hand, we omitted from that issue our customary forecast under the heading, U.S. and the World.

Even should it transpire, as seems unlikely, that some temporary peace be established in the near future in Europe, let no one believe the world turmoil will subside before the last of the seven perfect trines of Uranus to Neptune yet to come has been completed on March 11, 1943.

The world has started vast adjustments, in which the peril is not from the great economic changes which will take place, including new methods of financing and handling money, but from the probability that the necessity for making profound economic changes will be used as political bait to endeavor to deprive the people of America of that which alone makes true progress possible, their Bill of Rights.

So long as the channels to people's minds remain open there is hope for advancement, and tyrannies and great injustices cannot persistently be maintained. But when dictatorship gains the power to determine what information shall reach the people's minds, people have no better opportunity to become spiritual, truly to improve their minds, or to gain the physical things they want, than do domestic animals under the care of masters who may or may not be kindly disposed.

And that is the danger which faces the world during the next four years. Atheistic Materialism and its doctrine of using intellect and brute force to compel all others on the earth to subscribe to soul-denying beliefs is now on the rampage.

Russia, ruled by Uranus, found opportunity under the first two trines of Uranus to Neptune, July 7 and August 14, to encourage and support a conflict through which eventually it hopes to bring world-wide revolutions and make Stalin the master of the whole earth.

Stalin is determined to destroy both spirituality and every vestige of human liberty. He is the most powerful despot the world has ever known. While Nikola Lenin lived as dictator of Russia, at least the ideals of communism also were kept alive. But with the death of Lenin, there was a scramble for the spoils, and in that melee Stalin proved to be more ruthless and shrewd than the others. He devised a political machine which would do his bidding with no questions asked. All who opposed his plan to become the world's greatest tyrant were slain.

Progressed Mars has just come within the orb of the square of Uranus in the house of death (eighth) in his chart. This means before the end of two years there will be vast loss of life in Russia. When this aspect formed the first time he liquidated over half a million less important people who would not become his abject slaves, starved seven million Ukraine peasants to death to bend them to his will, and slaughtered 3,000 of his own military officers. Wherever he rules, anyone, great or small, who dares to voice an opinion not coincident with his own, is rubbed out with as little compunction as most people experience in killing a mosquito.

In Hitler's bull-headed determination to crush Poland, Stalin found the opportunity to start the great Bolshevik drive through which he hopes eventually to dominate the world, killing off those with brains he cannot make subservient to his own, slaying all religious leaders, and executing all those who possess property.

Before the last trine of Uranus to Neptune in 1943 has passed, the Hitler regime will have disappeared

and given way to Bolshevik penetration. In the mean time Russia will encourage war everywhere, and if necessary will actively engage in military operations to help crush England, France and the United States.

England will lose territory, and will be terribly crippled. Things will boil in the Orient. The greater the chaos the better will it suit Stalin. And there will be plenty of wholesale destruction.

But if he cannot get the United States into the war either with some of Europe or Japan, he will suffer the greatest disappointment of his life. It is his conviction that a year or two of war added to the ten years of economic depression we have already had will make the working people of America ripe for revolution.

God forbid that America shall be foolish enough, or unfortunate enough, to become involved in the world conflict; but if she does, she may look forward, under the changes Uranus trine Neptune will bring, to some who start as her allies finishing by fighting as her foes.

Our Constructive Attitude Needed.—Astrologically the balance of forces is just about 50-50 that the U.S. will stay out of the war. Thus whether we do or do not largely depends upon how susceptible we permit ourselves to become to the barrage of propaganda from without and within, and how much we think about war.

It is unintelligent when a disease threatens either an individual or a nation merely to ignore it. To prevent calamity we must carefully appraise the situation and map the best course of thought, feeling and action. That is the purpose of The Brotherhood of Light Control of Life Research Department; to determine the most effective way of handling thoughts, feelings and planetary energies. And in the present critical state of affairs it offers the suggestion that, without blinding ourselves to conditions, we all should keep our minds constructively engaged.

Dwelling on the war, listening persistently to radio broadcasts about the war, reading details in the papers about the war, all tune the individual in on the war. A psychological law is that action is in the direction of that which claims the attention. Thus the surest way for us to develop an attitude which will draw us into the war is to permit ourselves persistently to think war thoughts and feel war feelings. Instead, let us, other than to keep ourselves properly informed, engage our thoughts with matters which tend to benefit, rather than destroy, human beings.

We need not blind ourselves to the fact that the Mars Cycle, published in the September Quarterly, has that planet in a position which will make it difficult to keep our country free from embroilment with other nations, and will stir up strife over business at home. We need not delude ourselves that the Jupiter Cycle, here published, indicates freedom from subversive activities, even though it does signify some upswing in business. Knowing these things we will be prepared to guard against sabotage, and to counteract the influence of the war-mongering hot-heads. We will build up an armed might that, irrespective of any possible turn of events abroad, will be able to protect our shores.

War brutalizes all who engage in it. It is the foe of spirituality. Somewhere on earth there should remain a people free from this brutalizing influence; who, when the storm elsewhere has led to utter human exhaustion, will have preserved high ideals; a people economically and spiritually still vigorous enough to undertake the needed reconstruction. When this devastating hurricane of blood and selfish lust for power has passed, we in America, still neutral, and still proudly maintaining our Bill of Rights, should be prepared and willing to help build a new and far better world.
